

Epilepsy

Condition for which IVIg use is in exceptional circumstances only

Specific Conditions

- Epilepsy (rare childhood cases)

Level of Evidence

Evidence of probable benefit – more research needed (Category 2a)

- Landau–Kleffner syndrome
- Lennox–Gastaut syndrome

Intravenous immunoglobulin (IVIg) should be considered in childhood cases only after failure of all conventional therapies and full assessment by a Paediatric Neurologist.
